




Tiko is from Fiji

## Meet Tiko the Turtle!

Tiko means “stay” in Fijian.

**Bula!** (that's Fijian for Hello!)

My name is Tiko!

I am a hawksbill turtle and I live in the coral reefs that surround the Fiji islands. I may grow up to one metre in length and I weigh around 80 kilograms. My shell changes colour slightly depending on the temperature of the water. I eat sea sponges mainly, but I also eat jellyfish and sea anemones. I live part of my life in the open ocean, but I prefer to spend my time in shallow lagoons and coral reefs. I am eight years old, but my species can live till 40 years old. Fishing and pollution are threatening my species.

We are critically endangered, so we need your help to survive!  
By recycling, reusing and reducing, you can help protect us.



## Meet Koru the Kiwi!

Koru means “loop” in Maori\* and symbolises new life.


### Kia Ora (That’s Maori\* for Hello!)

I am Koru the Kiwi. I only live in New Zealand and the native forest is where I make my home. I am a direct descendant of the now extinct moas. I eat worms, insects, grubs, leaves, berries and seeds. I am a bird, but I cannot fly. I am semi-nocturnal and am about the same size as a domestic hen. I am 10 years old, but Kiwis can live up to 20 years of age. I am a boy but the females of my species are larger than males and they lay smooth ivory coloured eggs.

Sadly, clearing of native bushland, introduced predators, traps and motor vehicles have contributed to reduction of the kiwi population.




## Meet Noi the Elephant!


Noi means “young” in Thai

My name is Noi!

I am an Asian elephant and I am originally from Chiang Mai in northern Thailand. I am 5 years old but I hope to live to be 50! I am over 2 metres tall and weigh about 3,000 kilograms. Elephants are the largest land animals in the world. I eat grasses, small plants, bushes, fruit, twigs, and tree bark and need to eat for 16 hours each day to feed my big body! Due to poaching and habitat destruction, the world’s population of elephants is decreasing and, sadly, Asian elephants like me are considered endangered. Through your actions, you can help to ensure that elephants, all animals, and you humans all have a bright future!
